



Recently Married? Change your name online with Social Security!

Social Security continues to improve online services with features that make doing business with us easier and more secure. If you have legally changed your name after marriage, you can now update your name with Social Security and request a corrected card online through your personal **my Social Security** account if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen age 18 years or older with a U.S. mailing address; and
- Have a driver's license or a state-issued identification card; and
- Have a marriage certificate issued from **Missouri**, Arkansas, Georgia, South Dakota, or Wyoming.

To request a replacement card:

- Sign in to your personal **my Social Security** account.
- Select "Replace Your Social Security Card".
- Answer the screening questions to confirm eligibility.
- Enter state driver's license or state-issued ID information.
- Enter marriage data (e.g., date of marriage, location of marriage, and first and last name of each party (before marriage) from marriage document).

We recommend waiting at least 30 days after the date of marriage to request a replacement card. This time is needed for the state to update their records and confirm the marriage.

Whether you apply online or in-person, we will mail your card after we process your application, typically within 7-10 days.
